
## DIGGING INTO HISTORY: On the Road with Rochambeau

## Why Support Digging Into History: On the Road with Rochambeau?

Your support of this award-winning experiential education program will help high school students across Connecticut connect with history in a way that no book or classroom can do.

What do we mean by experiential education? This program is designed to take students out of the classroom and not just *into* history, but *experiencing* history. Our 2019 program brought Connecticut high school students together with French students to restore a line of trenches once occupied by Connecticut soldiers during the first German offensive against American troops during WWI. Through this work they gained a whole new perspective on the war and life on the Western Front, and a deep understanding of the relevance of history in their own lives.

This summer we're traveling back 250 years to the American Revolution. We'll be examining the role of the French Army in the war through an archaeological excavation of one of comte de Rochambeau's French Army camps in Bolton, Connecticut. We'll be bringing French students here to Connecticut to live and work side-by-side with Connecticut students to gain a deeper understanding of the Revolutionary War and the impact the French Army had on our nation. It may be a little harder to imagine what life for these soldiers was like in 1781, but we're going to try!

Experiential education programs like this are especially important for the generation that started high school in the Covid lockdown. With recent studies showing 40% of eighth graders in the United States scoring "below basic" in U.S. history last year, and only 13% were considered proficient, programs like Digging Into History are essential to ensure students learn about our nation's history. Getting students engaged in history through hands-on-learning is an important tool to help us preserve our shared history!

It isn't just the kids taking part in this program that will benefit. Our communities become more engaged when they see students, families, individuals, businesses, and institutions taking an interest in state and local history. This program engages the public by highlighting the hard work of our students, and our state's contributions to our national history.
